Recreation Assistance Program Eligibility



The Recreation Assistance Program provides Free Annual Membership to the Leduc Recreation Center to residents that meet the program eligibility.

You may qualify for FCSS Subsidy program if you meet the following criteria:

- 1. You are a current resident of the City of Leduc OR Rural Leduc County.
- 2. You can provide a current Notice of Assessment (NOA) for all adults in the household, OR
 - a. You are a new Permanent Resident, who arrived in Canada within the last year, so have not yet filed a tax return.
 - b. You are a Refugee, with a protection claimant document that was issued within the last year.
 - c. You Arrived through the Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel program within the last year.
- 3. Your household income is equal to or less than the amounts listed in the table below:

People in your Household	Maximum Total Household Income
1 Person	\$35,000
2 People	\$45,000
3 People	\$47,500
4 People	\$50,000
5 People	\$52,500
6 People	\$55,000
Add an additional S	52,500 for each additional person.

To calculate total household income, we use line 15000 on your Notice of Assessment. Total Household is calculated by adding the amounts on line 15000 for you and your spouse/partner (if applicable). You are eligible if your income is equal to or less than the amounts listed in this table for the number of eligible household members.

Who Does Not Qualify:

- Those who do not live in the City of Leduc or Rural Leduc County.
- Those with a household income that is higher than the income eligibility guidelines.
- Those who hold temporary residence visa/permit in Canada (Visitors Visa, Work Permit, Study Permit) and cannot provide a current Notice of Assessment.
- Those who cannot provide the required supporting documents as per the application process.

^{**}For the purposes of assessment, a **household** is defined as up to 2 total adult spouses/partners, and their legal dependants aged 17 and younger (dependants who are over the age of 17 will need to submit a separate application form with eligibility documents in their own name). Anyone living within the same home as your family who does not fall under these parameters will not count towards your eligible household members and must apply independently/with their own household.

^{***}Dependent Exception: if you have a dependent that is 18 years old and still in high school, they may be included on your application form.
